Cleaning Supplies: all-purpose spray cleaners, floor cleaners, sanitizing wipes, mops, buckets, brooms, dustpans, or sponges

Laundry Supplies: dryer sheets or detergent

Household Supplies: dish detergent, bottled hand soap, paper towels, tissues, toilet paper, garbage bags

Personal Care Items: feminine products or personal hygiene products and kits

Baby Supplies: diapers, wipes, baby wash, or shampoo/lotion

Gift Cards: gas, grocery, Uber, Walmart, Target, or Visa

RECIPE

This recipe is from Barb Gunn

CHRISTMAS PIZZA APPETIZER

- 1 pkg crescent roll dough, unrolled & cut into triangles
- 18 oz pkg cream cheese
- ¼ cup light sour cream
- ¼ cup mayo
- 3 T ranch dressing dry mix
- ¼ cup bell pepper, chopped
- ¼ cup finely chopped broccoli florets
- 1/3 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Preheat oven to 375

Arrange crescent roll triangles in the shape of a Christmas tree on a greased baking sheet. Pierce with a fork. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes.

Mix cream cheese, sour cream, salad dressing mix together. Spread mixture over the cooled crescent tree. Top with bell pepper, broccoli, and cheddar cheese. Chill for at least an hour.

NOTE: Any veg or meat of your choice can be the topping. I have used salami, ham, tomatoes, olives.

This was our second year serving since Covid got in our way. It was great the way the congregation, community, and friends came out to work with us and support us in our undertaking. We received many accolades for the delicious food and for offering such a warm and welcoming environment for people to sit and enjoy each other's company.

Many thanks to those who helped the supper a great success: Troop 64 Boy Scouts, early bird oyster dippers, afternoon and evening kitchen staff, quilters, servers, parking lot attendants, ticket sellers, craft room, musicians, and of course the coordination of all the pieces by the Livezey family, particularly Brad and Walt. We served 255 sit down dinners and 195 take out. Our gross receipts were approximately \$14,000 with a little over \$5,000 in expenses netting a profit around \$9,000. Kudos to us!
